Pregnancy Referrals in Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin

Badgernet Since the recent (August 2021) introduction of BadgerNet to The Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust the way in which women can refer the pregnancy has changed.

Self-Refer Online – Search for The Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital and navigate to the Maternity page (<https://www.sath.nhs.uk/wards-services/az-services/maternity/>). Here there is a message that states: “Already pregnant? You can come direct to us. Self-refer through our BadgerNet Maternity Notes System or call 01743 261085 to book an appointment.”

From here you will be directed to the Badgernet Maternity Notes Page – Badger Notes <https://www.sath.nhs.uk/wards-services/az-services/maternity/badgernet/>. You are able to click on the link or scan the QR code to begin the referral process directing you to <https://www.badgernotes.net/SelfReferral/CareLocation/SATH>

Over the phone Women are able to call 01743 261085 to book an appointment.

Through General Practice

GPs or practice staff are able to refer on the woman’s behalf using the same steps for self-referral. There is a question that asks if you are referring on someone’s behalf.

Basic information required to complete the Registration: Name, Date of Birth, Contact Telephone Number(s), Home Address. eMail address (if known), Language, First day of Last Menstrual Period, Registered GP. Once booked by the midwife, GPs will be notified of the pregnancy. GPs will receive the patient’s booking summary via the Docman system and a discharge summary following discharge for any inpatient admissions.
